The Living Farm Heritage Museum

The Howard County Antique Farm Machinery Club was started in 1995 by a group of people looking to preserve the farming heritage of Howard County, Maryland.

Our club's mission is to preserve the agricultural way of life that is too quickly disappearing throughout our community.

One of the main ways we meet this mission is by being the custodians and curators of the Howard County Living Farm Heritage Museum. We conduct programs and demonstrations as well as develop displays that tell visitors about the way of life in Historic Howard County. The **Hebb House**, built in the 1840's is the first structure that you will see when arriving at the Living Farm Heritage Museum. It is a 2-story farm house that we use to depict life on a farm between the 1930's – 1960's.



The **One Room School House** is a replica of a one room schoolhouse that would have been in Howard County in the early 1900's.

The **McCracken House** is our house depicting life before electricity. Our displays show life in the 1800's.



The **Dairy Barn and Milking Parlor** have many displays of life on a farm. The Milking Parlor shows displays of different ways of milking cows. The displays in the 2 story Dairy Barn show everything from clothes washing machines to a display of “field to table” items.

Our **1953 Plymouth Switcher Locomotive** is on display and will soon be part of a train ride around the museum property.



The **James Clark Main Display Building** is currently in its 2nd phase of construction. When complete it will be the museum's flagship structure. It hosts the Maryland Dairy Shrine along with many other displays to delight our museum visitors.
